One-half of basement is poured cement (north side) other stone,  
indicating use of a former basement.

Village minutes tell of tearing down old building by Wm. Gulick, Wm. Petty and Joseph Gulick. Records show D. E. Davis receiving \$25 and \$123 on old building and James Urch \$1,071 for same.  
Regular meeting held in new Fire Hall, October 5, 1925.
