The Clarkston Historic District Commission (HDC) approved a Certificate of Appropriateness (CoA) for removing a chain-link fence at 66 East Washington during a July 12, 2022 meeting, based on the application dated June 13, 2022.

This Certificate of Appropriateness is issued based on the application, information presented at the meeting, and a photograph that shows the subject fence in close proximity to a more-recently-constructed wood privacy fence.

Fencing proposed to be removed is a non-historic backyard chain link fence at or near the west side property line. The westerly neighbor (56 East Washington) recently erected a privacy-type fence a few inches to the west of this chain link fence. This CoA to remove the chain link fence is based on the fence being on the property line, or within the property boundaries, of 66 East Washington. Conference with the west side neighbor is advised.

This satisfies DOI Standard #9.

Homeowners must return to the Historic District Commission with any changes of design or materials

A Certificate of Appropriateness (CoA) is only approval for the requirements of the City of the Village of Clarkston Historic District and does not replace or supersede zoning, building construction permits, other city ordinances and legal requirements. A Historic District Commission CoA is valid for one year. If the approved work is not complete within that time, please contact the city office for review.
